A journey through time and artistry-Holy Trinity

Constructed between the 12th and 14th centuries in the southern Romanesque style, the church exudes an aura of historical significance.

Its solemn exterior conceals a treasure trove of artistry.

Within its walls, frescoes painted by John of Kastav around 1490 narrate biblical tales, the Passion of Christ, and the lives of saints.

The church becomes a canvas, showcasing the fusion of faith and artistic brilliance.



The church's ceilings, adorned with scenes from daily life and the liturgical calendar, offer glimpses into both the mundane and the divine.

Christ's Passion unfolds on the southernmost wall, with the Dance of Death residing just below, an extraordinary feat of medieval iconography.

These frescoes, discovered in 1951 by Jože Pohlen, showcase the creation of the world, the expulsion of Adam and Eve, and the agricultural endeavors of various seasons.

Koper, the largest town of Slovenian Istria and the home of about one half of the population of the Municipality of Koper, is also the only Slovenian port; in addition, it also hosts one of the Slovenian universities.

The town of Koper is considered to be one of the oldest Slovenian towns, with its rich history dating back to the Middle Bronze Age.

Koper was first populated during the time of the Romans and used to be an island; after the Roman Empire, several reigns and countries developed in the area, which led to its different names.

The original name of the settlement on the island where the town is located today was Aegida; during the Roman reign, the town was called Capris and later Insula Capraria (Goat Island); the Byzantines called it Justinopolis, while the patriarchs of Aquileia gave it the name Caput Histriae (Head of Istria).

Tito Square (Titov trg): Explore the heart of Koper with its Venetian-style architecture.

Praetorian Palace (Pretorska palača): Discover the rich history of Koper in this beautifully preserved palace.


Koper Cathedral (Stolnica Marijinega vnebovzetja): Admire the stunning interior and panoramic views from the bell tower.





Kamnik, town of three castles

Kamnik is considered one of the most beautiful medieval towns in Slovenia. Once a flourishing trading town, where the Counts of the Andes from Bavaria had their headquarters. In those days, Kamnik was the capital of Kranjska.

In the 11th century, the city hill boasted an impressive castle complex - MALI GRAD. Today, only the two-story Romanesque chapel with a crypt is preserved, which is also one of the main symbols of the city. From the hill there is a wonderful view of the town and the Kamnik-Savinjske Alps.

Walk through the halls of the Kamnik Intermunicipal Museum, the birthplace of Rudolf Maister, the rich Franciscan library, or discover Plečnik's heritage in the Kamnik area.

Revitalize your body and strengthen your immune system in the Tunjica Natural Medicinal Grove, the only Holistic Health Centre in Europe with scientific evidence of healing effects on health and body.

Who Benefits the most: The medieval town of Kamnik and its surrounding area offer many opportunities for recreation and sports activities.

Volčji Potok Arboretum

In the colorful world of plants.

Every year, at the end of April, two million tulips bloom in the Volčji Potok Arboretum. Next to them, of course, there are many other flowers that announce the arrival of the awakening spring.

But not only in spring, Volčji Potok Arboretum offers the possibility of walks in the vivid color spectrum of plants from all over the world in all seasons.

There are two big rose gardens in the Arboretum Volčji Potok which boast 6.000 rose plants of 1,250 varieties. The flowering time extends from mid-May till October with the peak in June.

In November 2022 at the World Federation of Rose Societies' World Convention, Arboretum Volčji Potok received the Award of Garden Excellence.

This means that rose gardens at Arboretum Volčji Potok were included to the selection of the most wonderful rose gardens of the world.





Arboretum Volčji Potok is the biggest (85 ha) and most visited botanic garden in Slovenia.

It originally formed part of the Souvan family estate in 1885, which was taken over by the University of Ljubljana in 1952 and legally declared a place of cultural and natural heritage of national importance.



Big Pasture Plateau. Velika planina

Among the shepherds on the big mountain.

If we head north from Kamnik, we arrive in the valley of Kamniška Bistrica, where we can enjoy the beauty of unspoilt nature and cool off in the hot summer months.

Kamniška Bistrica, which attracts many walkers, mountaineers, hunters and fishermen, is also an excellent starting point for hikes to the peaks of the Kamniška-Savinja Alps.

Velika planina is the most visited among the Kamnik peaks, which is considered the most beautiful Slovenian mountain due to its exceptional views and preserved pastoral heritage.

The tradition of shepherding is presented in the only preserved oval shepherd's hut, the Preskar museum, and the chapel of Maria Snežna also has a special place in the shepherd's settlement. Velika planina is characterized by:

small thorn cheeses with strong love symbolism.

In the summer, the mountain offers many opportunities for wonderful walks and encounters with the life of shepherds, and it is especially magical in the winter, when it is covered with a blanket of white snow.

You can visit Velika Planina by following wellmarked mountain trails, or you can choose the cable car from the valley of Kamniška Bistrica and then the new chairlift that takes you to the top of Velika Planina.


For several years now, Bled has been advocating green tourism and is the proud recipient of the gold label of the Green Scheme of Slovenian Tourism.

Potica

Ingredients for the dough:

- 500 g of flour
- 1 cube of fresh yeast
- 1 dl of milk
- 80 g of sugar
- 2 egg yolks
- 100 g of butter
- · Pinch of salt

Ingredients for the filling:

- 300 g ground walnuts
- 150 g of sugar
- 2 dl of milk
- 2 egg yolks
- pinch of vanilla
- Lemon peel

Preparation:

- Heat the milk in a saucepan and melt the butter.
- Dissolve the yeast in warm milk.
- In a large bowl, combine the flour, sugar, egg yolks, salt and butter mixture.
- Add the dissolved yeast and mix well.
- Let the dough rise for 1 hour.
- Meanwhile, prepare the filling: mix walnuts, sugar, milk, egg yolks, vanilla and lemon zest in a pan.
- Roll out the dough on a floured surface and cover it with the filling.
- Roll the dough into a ball and place it in the pan.
- Bake in a preheated oven at 180°C for about 45 minutes.



Homemade cottage cheese Štruklji

Ingredients:

- 300 g of white flour
- legg
- 1 tablespoon of olive oil
- 1 pinch of salt
- About 150 ml of water (for kneading)

Ingredients for the filling:

- 500 g of cottage cheese
- 2 eggs
- 2 tablespoons of sugar
- 1 vanilla sugar (optional)
- 1 lemon peel (grated)
- 1 pinch of salt

Preparation:

Preparation:

Mix the flour and a pinch of salt in a bowl. In a separate bowl, scramble the egg and add the olive oil. Gradually add the egg mixture to the flour and mix.

Gradually add water while mixing until you get an elastic dough.

The dough should not be too sticky. Knead the dough on a floured surface for about 5 minutes until smooth.

Shape it into a ball, cover with a cloth and leave to rest for 30 minutes.

Preparation of the filling: Mix cottage cheese, eggs, sugar, vanilla sugar (if using), grated lemon zest and a pinch of salt in a bowl. Mix well to get a uniform mass. Assembly and cooking: Roll out the dough on a floured surface to obtain a rectangular sheet of dough about 3 mm thick. Spread the prepared filling evenly over the dough.

Roll the dough with the filling into rolls. Press the edges together well so they don't open during cooking. Place the dumplings in a pot of boiling salted water. Cook them for about 30-40 minutes. Drain the cooked štrukli and cut into slices.

Serve them warm, sprinkled with sugar or topped with whipped cream if desired.

This is a classic recipe for homemade cottage cheese štruklja, which are a popular traditional dish in Slovenia. Enjoy the flavors!



Fuži with Truffles and Cream

Ingredients:

- 250 g fuže (Istrian pasta)
- 30 g of fresh truffles or truffles
- 2 tablespoons of olive oil
- 1 onion, finely chopped
- 2 cloves of garlic, chopped

- 200 ml of cooking cream
- Salt and pepper to taste
- Parmesan cheese (optional)

Preparation:

Bring salted water to a boil in a large pot and cook the fudge until al dente, which means they are still firm to the bite. Then drain and set aside.

While the fudge is cooking, heat the olive oil in a pan over medium heat. Add the onion and garlic and cook until the onion is translucent and soft.

Add chopped truffles or truffles to the pan and fry them for 2-3 minutes to release their flavor.

Pour the cooking cream into the pan with the added truffles. Stir and cook over low heat for about 5 minutes to thicken the sauce. If necessary, add salt and pepper to taste.

When the sauce is ready, add the cooked fugues to it. Toss gently to coat the pasta with the sauce.

If desired, sprinkle with freshly grated parmesan cheese.

Serve immediately and enjoy the flavors of Istria!

This dish is a great example of Istrian cuisine, which is famous for its use of truffles and delicious pasta such as fuji.



Jota (Slovenian Sour Soup)

Ingredients:

- 1 cup beans (usually corn, but you can also use white beans)
- 1 cup sauerkraut
- · 2 potatoes, peeled and diced
- 1 onion, finely chopped
- 1 clove of garlic, chopped

- 1 bay leaf
- 2 tablespoons of vegetable oil
- 1 tablespoon of flour
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 1 sausage of your choice (e.g. Carniola sausage), cut into rings (optional)

Preparation:

Heat the oil in a large pot over medium heat. Add the finely chopped onion and fry until soft and translucent.

Add the chopped garlic and fry for another minute or so until fragrant.

Add the flour and fry for a few more minutes until it turns slightly golden. Be careful not to brown the flour too much.

Add the sliced potatoes to the pot and fry them for a few minutes, then add the beans, sauerkraut and bay leaves. Mix everything well.

Pour water so that the ingredients are covered. Add salt and pepper to taste.

Cook on low for about an hour, until the potatoes and beans are tender. Stir occasionally during cooking.

In the meantime, you can cook the sausage in a special pot, if you are using it. When it is cooked, cut it into rings.

Serve the soup in deep plates, add slices of sausage if desired and serve it with a piece of bread.

Jota is a traditional Slovenian dish that goes perfectly with cold winter days. It's delicious, full of vitamins and fiber, and great for warming up. Bon Appetit!
